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What's the best stain colour to hide weathering on an older Calgary cedar deck?

Medium brown or cedar-toned semi-transparent stains are your best bet for hiding weathering on an older Calgary cedar deck while still showing the wood grain. These colours naturally camouflage the grey patina, uneven weathering, and minor surface imperfections that develop on cedar exposed to Calgary's intense UV and extreme temperature swings.

Calgary's elevation and dry climate create particularly harsh conditions for cedar decking. On severely weathered cedar, consider a deck brightener after cleaning to restore some of the wood's natural colour before staining.

For application in Calgary conditions, choose a day when temperatures will stay between 15-25°C with no rain forecast for 24 hours. Apply stain in thin, even coats following the wood grain, and avoid working in direct sunlight

Water-based deck stains typically cost \$15-25 more per gallon than oil-based products in Calgary, but the total project cost difference is usually minimal due to application and maintenance factors. 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How much does a professional charge to power wash and stain a 300 square foot deck in Calgary?

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Should I stain or paint my backyard fence in Calgary for the longest-lasting finish?

Stain your backyard fence in Calgary — specifically with a penetrating oil-based or hybrid stain rather than paint. How long should a new pressure-treated deck dry before staining in Calgary's dry climate?

New pressure-treated lumber in Calgary should dry for 3-6 months before staining, significantly longer than the 2-4 weeks often recommended in more humid climates. Calgary's intense UV radiation and low humidity actually create a unique situation where the lumber dries faster on the surface but retains moisture deeper in the wood grain.

The key test is the water droplet method: sprinkle water on the deck surface and watch what happens. If the water beads up and rolls off, the wood is still too wet from treatment chemicals and needs more drying time. When water soaks into the wood within 5-10 minutes, it's ready for stain. This typically happens around the 4-month mark in Calgary, though south-facing decks exposed to chinook winds may be ready sooner.

Calgary's extreme temperature swings from chinooks create additional considerations. 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How much does it cost to stain a new pressure-treated deck in Calgary?

Staining a new pressure-treated deck in Calgary typically costs **\$3.50-6.00 per square foot** professionally installed, or **\$1.50-2.50 per square foot** for materials if you're doing it yourself. How much does it cost to strip and restain a weathered deck in Calgary that hasn't been maintained?

Stripping and restaining a severely weathered deck in Calgary typically costs \$4-8 per square foot, meaning a standard 300 square foot deck runs \$1,200-\$2,400 professionally. For a neglected deck requiring extensive prep work, expect to pay toward the higher end of this range due to the additional labor involved in proper surface restoration.

What colour deck stain is most popular in Calgary and which ones fade the least?

Medium brown and natural cedar tones are the most popular deck stain colours in Calgary, with semi-transparent formulations dominating the market. These earth tones complement Calgary's natural landscape and work well with the prevalent stone, stucco, and brick exterior finishes found throughout communities from Aspen Woods to McKenzie Towne.

Calgary's intense UV radiation at 1,045 metres elevation creates some of the harshest fading conditions in Canada.

Semi-transparent stains in medium to dark brown tones fade the least because they contain enough pigment to absorb UV rays while still allowing the wood grain to show through. Popular fade-resistant options include **Benjamin Moore Arborcoat Semi-Transparent in "Chocolate" or "Chestnut," Sherwin-Williams SuperDeck in "Cedar" or "Redwood Natural,"** and **Sikkens Cetol SRD in "Mahogany" or "Cedar."** These products typically maintain their colour for 3-4 years on Calgary decks versus 2-3 years for lighter tones.

Clear stains and light honey tones fade fastest in Calgary's conditions — often showing significant colour loss within 18 months on south-facing deck surfaces. The chinook winds that regularly blast Calgary create additional UV exposure as they clear away protective cloud cover, intensifying the sun's bleaching effect. West-facing decks suffer the most, receiving both intense afternoon UV and the full force of chinook winds.

Solid colour stains offer maximum fade resistance but sacrifice the natural wood appearance most Calgary homeowners prefer.
