Is fabric wallpaper a good choice for a Calgary home theatre room?

Fabric wallpaper can be an excellent choice for a Calgary home theatre room, offering superior acoustics and luxurious aesthetics, but it requires careful consideration of Calgary's extremely dry climate and specific installation techniques to prevent shrinkage and seam separation.

Fabric wallpaper provides significant acoustic benefits that make it particularly valuable in home theatre applications. How long does professionally installed wallpaper last in a Calgary home?

Is removable wallpaper a good option for a Calgary rental property accent wall?

How much does it cost to strip multiple layers of old wallpaper in a 1960s Calgary bungalow?

Stripping multiple layers of wallpaper in a 1960s Calgary bungalow typically costs \$3.50-\$8.00 per square foot professionally, or \$200-\$600 in materials and tool rental for a determined DIYer. Can wallpaper be installed over painted drywall or does it need special prep in Calgary?

Yes, wallpaper can be installed over painted drywall in Calgary, but proper surface preparation is critical for long-term adhesion, especially given our dry climate conditions. Can I put peel-and-stick wallpaper over textured walls in my Calgary home?

Peel-and-stick wallpaper will not adhere properly to textured walls — the adhesive needs continuous contact with a smooth surface to create a lasting bond. What happens to wallpaper adhesion during chinook events when humidity changes rapidly in Calgary?

Chinook winds create severe wallpaper adhesion problems in Calgary homes due to rapid humidity and temperature fluctuations that cause both the wallpaper and wall substrate to expand and contract at different rates.
